Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Distin Cottage is located in a residential neighborhood on a standard size lot, in the south central section of the incorporated village of Saranac Iake, Franklin County. Approximately one-half mile from the downtown area, the house is situated on the eastern side of a hill which gently slopes at the eastern side and gradually comes to a steeper incline at the western edge to the rear of the house. The house is oriented toward the east, overlooking Kiwassa Road, which runs in a north to south direction. There is a wooded area to the west and south of the house and an asphalt driveway which runs from east to west along its northern side. This driveway is used in common with a neighbor on the lot to the north. There is open lawn area in front of the house, measuring approximately forty feet to the road.

The Distin Cottage is a two story, single family dwelling of average size for the neighborhood. The floor plan is in an L-shape, with the principle entry located in the crook of the "L" on the northeast side. The door at this entrance consists of diamond paned glass over six panels and opens into a small vestibule on the interior of the house. At the basement level there is a garage with an entrance facing north, and above the garage, a large porch which is screened on the north and east sides and has two fifteen-light sliding windows on the south side. Although this porch was probably used for additional "sitting out" space, it has insufficient accessibility to be a true cure porch. This garage and porch area has a hipped roof.

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The "L" has a hipped roof with a clipped gable and dormers at the center of the north and east side. The roofing material is asphalt shingle. The siding is cedar shingle. The foundation is of coursed rubble stone. There are two chimneys; the interior being of coursed rubble stone, and the exterior chimney located on the southern side of the house is of coursed rubble with stucco above the roof line. Windows throughout the residence are six-over-one sash.

There is one cure porch located on the southwestern corner of the southern side. This is a small cure porch, measuring approximately 8 by 10 feet, being just barely large enough to turn a bed. It is reached through a 33 inch wide, eight-light door from the interior family room. The walls and ceiling are finished in beaded board and the floor is of painted fir. It has a shed-style roof and was built on piers. The projecting porch is enclosed on the three sides by two 36-light sliding windows on each side.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Distin Cottage is architecturally significant as an outstanding example of a single family dwelling designed to function as a private cure cottage. Built between 1915 and 1925 and designed by prominent Saranac Lake architect William G. Distin, this two story house served as the Distin family home until his father, William L. Distin, a photographer, died of tuberculosis in 1930. At that time the Distin family sold the house to the Downs family. Mr. Downs, a Dupont scientist had tuberculosis and came to the village with his family to seek relief from his illness.

Designed by William G. Distin, the house is believed to have been built by Branch and Callahan, prominent builders in Saranac Lake and the Adirondack region during the period of significance. It is an outstanding example of a private residence built during the second boom period of growth (1918-1939). During this era, one type of cure cottage was the single family cure cottage, purchased or rented by wealthier patients who could afford not to reside in boarding house or public sanitariums.

The cure cottages of Saranac Lake were predominantly built between the years of 1870 and 1930 and represent almost every housing type popular in the late Nineteenth and early Twentieth century. They represent vernacular expressions of architectural styles which include Italianate, Queen Anne, Colonial Revival, Tudor Revival, and bungalow stylistic features. The majority of the cottages which remain were built between 1890 and 1930.

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
The most common cure cottages are vernacular expressions of the Queen Anne and Colonial Revival styles, with multiple gables, balloon frame construction, decorative wooden architectural detail, multiple windows of various sizes and shapes, and associated porches or verandas. Glass-enclosed porches, used for the curing of tuberculosis patients, are the most salient feature of the cure cottage. They can be found on local structures built long after porches had gone out of fashion elsewhere.


Cure cottages are structures which can be commercial, residential or institutional in scale and expression. Many were built specifically to function as private commercial sanitoria, multiple unit dwellings, boarding houses, or private homes. Equally large numbers of cure cottages were adapted for that use from vernacular single family dwellings. All cure cottages display certain architectural features which were necessary for specific functions in the process of curing tuberculosis outdoors. Whether added at a later date or incorporated into the original building design, these features can include multiple-storied cure porches, sliding glass panels, call bells, and wider-than-usual doorways without sills.

The Distin Cottage retains the characteristic architectural elements of this type of building, including many windows of various sizes and shapes for maximum lighting and ventilation, and a prominent projecting cure porch. The cure porch located at the southwest corner of the building as prescribed by physicians resident in the village, is enclosed with six 36-light sliding windows.
