Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Musselman Cottage is located at 25 Riverside Drive, a residential street overlooking Lake Flower, one block from the commercial district of the village of Saranac Lake, Franklin County. The house is set back on its lot and is screened from Riverside Drive by several white pine trees. A non-contributing two car garage is situated on the northeast corner of the lot at street level. The rear of the property is completely wooded.

The house is approached via several winding flights of concrete steps leading to a large veranda. This two and one-half story, frame, single family house has a central block with two attached porches. The house rests on a foundation of uncoursed rubble and is covered by a metal shingle clad cross gabled roof. The original clapboard siding remains on the building except where replaced by aluminum siding on the northwest and southwest facades. Fenestration is varied in size and shape and is asymmetrically placed. Generally, windows throughout the residence contain double-hung sash with single lights. Several windows feature diamond panes. The front (east) elevation is dominated by an open veranda, which wraps around the east and south elevations of the building. The veranda is glazed at both ends. The main entrance to the residence is located under the veranda on the principal (east) facade. A glazed cure porch is situated above the veranda on the south elevation of the house. The exterior of this house is generally characterized by asymmetrical placement of wings, porches, and fenestration.

The principal entrance leads to a receiving room. The floor plan is two rooms deep with a living room, dining room, kitchen and pantry on the first floor. Walls and ceilings are painted plaster with natural wood paneling and ceiling beams. The wood moldings and details remain intact.

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The stair to the second floor is to the right of the principal entrance, situated at the rear of the receiving room. There are six bedrooms and four bathrooms in the house.

The only cure porch is located on the second elevation, east corner, accessible through a bedroom. It measures 8 by 8 feet and features a sloping wood floor. The wall and ceiling finish is painted, beaded board. The porch is enclosed with a number of fixed and sliding glazed panels.

The upper one-half story contains the servants quarters. There is a hatchway in the ceiling leading to the attic.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Musselman Cottage, built ca.1907, is architecturally significant as an outstanding example of a boarding house type cure cottage of the early twentieth century. The building was a registered private sanatorium operated as a boarding house by Mrs. William Mulflur in 1927 and by Mr. Sam Green in 1931. The house was probably built for E. Franklin Musselman who owned and occupied it from 1910 to 1915. As was common in the early Twentieth century, large private homes were used as boarding house type cure cottages during the height of the cure industry at Saranac Lake.

The cure cottages of Saranac Lake were predominantly built between the years of 1870 and 1930 and represent almost every housing type popular in the late Nineteenth and early Twentieth century. They represent vernacular expressions of architectural styles which include Italianate, Queen Anne, Colonial Revival, Tudor Revival, and bungalow stylistic features. The majority of the cottages which remain were built between 1890 and 1930.

The most common cure cottages are vernacular expressions of the Queen Anne and Colonial Revival styles, with multiple gables, balloon frame construction, decorative wooden architectural detail, multiple windows of various sizes and shapes, and associated porches or verandas. Glass-enclosed porches, used for the curing of tuberculosis patients, are the most salient feature of the cure cottage. They can be found on local structures built long after porches had gone out of fashion elsewhere.

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Cure cottages are structures that can be commercial, residential or institutional in scale and expression. Many were built specifically to function as private commercial sanitoria, multiple unit dwellings, boarding houses, or private homes. Equally large numbers of cure cottages were adapted for that use from vernacular single family dwellings. All cure cottages display certain architectural features which were necessary for specific functions in the process of curing tuberculosis outdoors. Whether added at a later date or incorporated into the original building design, these features can include multiple-storied cure porches, sliding glass panels, call bells and wider-than-usual doorways without sills.

Architecturally, the building retains a high degree of integrity to the period of significance and is an outstanding example of the boarding house type cure cottage. The interior wood work and the high quality and quantity of architectural elements which remain make this an exceptional example of this type of building.
